Scientists: Gravity Probe B continuing to perform well

One month into its mission, scientists said Gravity Probe B is continuing to perform well. The spacecraft's orbit remains stable and meets requirements for its June transition into the mission's science phase. Gravity Probe B will use ultra-precise gyroscopes to test Einstein's theory that space and time are distorted by the presence of massive objects. The Marshall Center manages the Gravity Probe B program for NASA's Office of Space Science.
