U.S. Space & Rocket Center to recognize Saturn V donors

The U.S. Space & Rocket Center is creating a pathway and courtyard to recognize donors who participate in helping restore the Saturn V rocket on the museum's grounds. An "Apollo Walk" leading to a building housing the rocket will be made of bricks with the names of donors etched into them. The bricks cost \$100 and can be personalized with two lines of 17-20 characters each. An "Apollo Circle" courtyard will be made of tiles that will sell for \$1,000 each.
