STS-100 set to launch Thursday, 1:41 p.m. CDT

Shuttle mission STS-100 is set to launch at 1:41 p.m. CDT Thursday from Kennedy Space Center in Florida. In addition to Marshall-managed propulsion elements, the mission includes a host of Marshall-related payloads including the Raffaello Multi-Purpose Logistics Module; Spacelab Logistics Pallet carrying the Space Station Remote Manipulator System and the Ultra High Frequency (UHF) Antenna; EXPRESS racks; Payload Equipment Restraint System and three commercial experiments managed by Marshall.
