Paving way for X-37, third X-40A free flight successful

The third in a series of up to seven free flight tests of the X-40A was conducted Thursday at Dryden Flight Research Center at Edwards, Calif. The test objectives focused on complex maneuvers such as monitoring vehicle performance when the nose is raised and lowered. The tests are part of the Marshall-managed X-37 program. Each test of the X-40A provides a better understanding of the systems that later will guide the flight of the X-37.
