Countdown Under Way for Launch Of Space Shuttle Discovery Thurs.

The Space Shuttle Discovery is set to launch at 9:41 a.m. CDT Thurs. During the 11-day mission, the crew of STS-85 will deploy and retrieve a science satellite and test a small robotic arm identical to the one that will be used on the International Space Station's Japanese Experiment Module. A set of protein crystal growth experiments, managed by Marshall Center, is also aboard the flight. The Shuttle is scheduled to land Monday, Aug. 18.
