Senate confirms O'Keefe as new NASA administrator

Sean O'Keefe was unanimously confirmed for the position of NASA administrator Dec. 21 by the U.S. Senate. O'Keefe will succeed Dan Goldin. O'Keefe has said his top priority at NASA would be to sort out the agency's finances, but not at the expense of scientific innovation. He also said he wants to reach out to the younger generation and reignite the space fervor of the 1960s when humans first walked on the Moon.
