Shuttle Discovery, crew return safely to Earth Monday

The orbiter Discovery landed successfully at 7:01 p.m. EST Monday on its second landing opportunity. The first landing opportunity was waved off due to unacceptably high cross winds at the Shuttle Landing Facility. On this mission, STS-103, the orbiter and crew traveled over 3,267,000 miles and repaired the Hubble Space Telescope.
