NASA managers set Shuttle launch for Dec. 11

NASA managers Thursday set Dec. 11 as the launch date for the final Space Shuttle mission this century. The 96th Space Shuttle mission includes four space walks to service the Hubble Space Telescope. Discovery is scheduled to lift off from Launch Pad 39-B at Kennedy Space Center, Fla., at 12:13 a.m. EST. The planned 10-day flight is scheduled to land at 9:21 p.m. Dec. 20 at Kennedy.
