## Jan. 31 targeted as launch date for next Shuttle mission

The NASA readiness review Wednesday determined that Space Shuttle Endeavor will launch no earlier than Jan. 31. The 11-day mission will map regions that are home to 95 percent of the world's population. Two antennae will be used to gather images, including one on a 197-foot mast that will be the largest fixed structure ever flown in space.
