Space Shuttle Atlantis is scheduled to land at 6:57 a.m. CST Wednesday at KSC. Astronaut John Blaha has joined the crew for a return to Earth after four months aboard the Russian space station Mir. Astronaut Jerry Linenger, who was carried aboard Atlantis to Mir, now begins his scheduled four-month stay in space.
