U.S. Reps. Rohrabacher and Gordon to visit Marshall Center Thursday

U.S. Rep. Dana Rohrabacher of California, chairman of the Space and Aeronautics Subcommittee of the House Science Committee; and U.S. Rep. Bart Gordon of Tennessee, ranking minority member of the subcommittee, will visit the Marshall Center Thursday. Also visiting are committee staff members James Muncy and Dr. Richard Obermann. NASA Administrator Dan Goldin and Joseph Rothenberg, NASA associate administrator for Space Flight, will accompany the group for a Marshall overview and tour of Center facilities. They will discuss commercial development of space, space solar power, and X-33/34 flight demonstrators. They will be briefed on Marshall's Advanced Space Transportation Technology and Microgravity Research Programs, and tour the Productivity Enhancement Complex.
