Students, Marshall Scientists Study 'What's Hot' in Salt Lake City Today

Researchers from the Global Hydrology and Climate Center at Marshall will team with students and Salt Lake City-area government agencies today to study how rapid urbanization has affected climate and air quality in urban areas. A specially instrumented NASA plane will fly over the city to produce a thermal map of the area. Marshall researchers also will launch a weather balloon to measure atmospheric conditions.
