## Discovery Set for Launch Today

STS-91 is scheduled for launch at approximately 5:10 p.m. CDT Tuesday. Loading of the Marshall-managed first super lightweight external tank with its flight load of cryogenic propellants was set for 8:14-11:14 a.m. CDT Tuesday. The improved tank was developed to increase Shuttle performance for the International Space Station assembly flights. This final nine-day Shuttle/Mir docking mission will bring home NASA astronaut Andrew Thomas.
