Three Marshall-Managed Payloads Launched Tues. Aboard Discovery

Three Marshall-managed science experiments launched Tuesday aboard Space Shuttle Discovery, as part of mission STS-91. One of the experiments could lead to improved methods of fire safety, while another could aid the development of better flu treatments and disease-fighting drugs. The third experiment, through observations not possible on Earth because of gravity, may help researchers better understand the changes and effects of a gas used to cool refrigerators.
