Marshall payloads head to Space Station on Discovery

The next flight of Space Shuttle Discovery — scheduled to launch at 5:42 a.m. CST, Thursday — will carry the three-members Expedition Two crew to their new home on orbit. During the 11-day mission, the Space Station will receive its new crew, and several Marshall-managed payloads: the Leonardo Multi-Purpose Logistics Module, the Human Research Facility, and the Payload Equipment Restraint System. With this flight, the Payload Operation Center at Marshall begins 24-hour-a-day operation.
