Marshall Inventors Hand Over Knee Brace Design to Industry

Marshall engineers have turned over the final design and prototype for an innovative knee brace to industry partners at Horton's Orthotic Lab in Little Rock, Ark. The knee brace that uses Space Shuttle propulsion technology is now one step closer to being made available to help knee injury and stroke patients and may potentially serve people with spinal cord injuries and birth defects.
