Hoover Selected Member of NASA's New Virtual Astrobiology Institute

The electronic "virtual" laboratory will conduct research on the complex issue of life in the universe and its cosmic implications. At Marshall, Hoover studies the microfossils in ancient rocks to help predict how the beginnings of life outside our planet might appear.
