U.S. - Russian Space Council Visits Marshall Wed. & Thurs.

Academician Vladimir Fedorovich Utkin, chairman of the U.S. - Russian Scientific and Technological Advisory Council, is visiting Marshall Wednesday. The council is meeting in Huntsville this week to present findings of Russian space research sponsored by NASA. Other council participants will visit the Center Thursday. The International Space Station and space transportation will be featured topics of discussion during their visit.

Lightning Sensor to Pave the Way To Better Weather Forecasting

Marshall's Lightning Imaging Sensor is scheduled for launch Nov. 18 aboard the Tropical Rainfall Measuring Mission. The sensor is the first step toward using space-based instruments to provide weather forecasters with real-time lightning data -- an invaluable tool for storm "nowcasting" and issuing advance storm warnings. The Lightning Imaging Sensor was developed by the Global Hydrology and Climate Center and Marshall.
