USMP-4 Spacelab Experiments Yielding Valuable Science

Research results from the fourth U.S. Microgravity Payload Mission continue to pour into the Spacelab Operations Control Center at Marshall as experiments continue aboard Columbia. Overnight, the crew conducted additional runs of the Particle Engulfment and Push experiment in the glovebox while dendrites continued to grow in a payload bay experiment. On Monday, a 70-hour-long melting and solidification experiment will begin in the Advanced Automated Directional Solidification Furnace.
