Leonids meteor shower to peak before dawn Thursday

In North Alabama, peak viewing time for the annual Leonids meteor shower will be just before dawn Thursday. The Leonids meteor showers occur each November when the Earth passes through the debris shed from periodic comet 55P/Temple-Tuttle. The meteors, named the Leonids because they appear to stream from the constellation Leo, are about the size of a grain of sand.
