The first crew to inhabit the International Space Station launched at 1:53 a.m. CST Tuesday from Kazakhstan, Russia. The Expedition One crew — Commander Bill Shepherd, a U.S. astronaut, and Soyuz Commander Yuri Gidzenko and Flight Engineer Sergei Krikalev, both cosmonauts — will occupy the Space Station for four months.
