Mayor Spencer Presents Space Week Proclamation to Center

Huntsville Mayor Loretta Spencer presented a resolution to Center Director Wayne Littles Wednesday. She presented the resolution on behalf of the Madison County Commission and the cities of Huntsville and Madison.
