STS-95 mission set to launch Oct. 29; Glenn to conduct microgravity studies

Following completion of a flight readiness review meeting, NASA managers set Oct. 29 as the official launch date for the STS-95 mission aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery. During the scheduled nine-day flight, seven astronauts will conduct more than 80 scientific experiments — including 54 Marshall-managed Microgravity Research Program experiments. STS-95 crew member John Glenn will conduct microgravity experiments aimed at improving fundamental scientific knowledge.
